HOLY YEAR OF MERCY

"The Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy is a major event in the Catholic Church, which is being held from the Feast of the Immaculate Conception (December 8, 2015) to the Feast of Christ the King (November 20, 2016)). Like previous jubilees, it will be a special, holy year of remission of sins and universal pardon, focusing particularly on God's forgiveness and mercy. It is an extraordinary Jubilee because it had not been predetermined long before; usually jubilees take place every 25 years. In fact, the 2016 Jubilee was first announced by Pope Francis on March 13, 2015. It is the 27th Holy Year in history, following the 2000 Jubilee during the St. John Paul II papacy."

ADDITIONAL PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT DAYS

For the first time in BC's history, the curriculum in all subject areas has been revised at the same time. You may be aware that we are in the first year of a three-year plan to implement this new curriculum. This year is the beginning of the transition, with a full shift to the new K - 7 curriculums to take place in September 2016. As part of the CISVA's plan to support the execution of the new curriculum, schools are required to add two additional professional development days to this school year. This additional time will be used for the purpose of enabling teachers to participate in professional development related to the implementation of the redesigned BC curriculum. Please mark your calendars with a note that the school will be closed on the following two days: Monday, April 18th, 2016 and Friday, May 20th, 2016.

FLU SEASON

While we can't prevent all infections, we can control the spread of illnesses, especially in a school setting. Please keep sick children at home, not only for their own well-being but also out of consideration for their teachers and classmates. We are asking for your cooperation in following the advice given to us by the Fraser Health Authority. If your child(ren) have flu-like symptoms, including fever, vomiting and/or diarrhea, it is important that they do not return to school for at least two full days after their symptoms have cleared. It is also recommended that they do not attend any group events such as birthday parties etc. until at least 48 hours after their symptoms have cleared. We would like your help in encouraging your children to wash their hands thoroughly with warm water and soap after using the washroom and prior to eating and remind your child to cough or sneeze into their elbow (not their hands).
