CHECK YOUR EMAILS!

In the last week we have had to send out a multitude of emails. Some parents have reported that they have not been receiving these emails from the school. Please check your SPAM folder/JUNK mail as emails from the school office or principal's office may be going into that folder. The school uses the emails provided on your registration or re-registration forms.

We send out emails to all parents using a master list and we also send out emails to one grade at a time using the same master list of emails. If you are receiving emails from your child's teacher then you should also be receiving emails from the school office UNLESS you gave the teacher a different email. Please contact the office if you are not receiving the emails (BUT first check your SPAM and JUNK folders).

I understand how challenging these times are for everyone. The information I send you is all the information that I am allowed to send. The Health Authority will NOT permit me to provide you with any more details.

I do thank the parents who are letting me know immediately of any news about test results. This allows me to speed up the process with Fraser Health and get the information out to you all as quickly as possible.

I extend my gratitude to the staff who are working very hard to ensure that all protocols are followed and making sure that the school is very safe.

HOW AT HOME LEARNING WORKS...

Teachers will only be able to provide at home learning packages to the following students:

- 1) Students who have tested positive for COVID and are at home recovering.
 - 2) Students who have been asked to self-isolate.
 - 3) Students who are in the Transitional Learning Option.

As you can imagine, it becomes very difficult for teachers to organize learning packages for students going in and out of in-school learning.

If you choose to keep your children home for any other reason than the ones stated above, teachers will NOT be able to provide learning packages. If you choose to move your child into transitional learning you MUST provide the teacher one week notice to prepare materials AND you must give the teacher one week notice before sending your child back to school. We understand how difficult this is and we also need to understand how difficult this is for our teachers.

Please note that primary at-home learning and intermediate at-home learning will look different due to the technology platforms used in primary and intermediate. If you have any specific questions about at-home learning, please speak to your child's teacher directly.

WHEN CAN YOUR CHILD RETURN TO SCHOOL IF HE/SHE IS RECOVERING FROM COVID OR HAS HAD TO SELF-ISOLATE DUE TO A POSSIBLE EXPOSURE?

- 1) Covid positive person: after self-isolation (duration is determined by public health) is over, the individual can return to school and other activities. The self-isolation duration is usually 10 days from symptoms onset.
- 2) Person told to self-isolate due to possible exposure to a covid positive case: self-isolate for 14 days from last contact with covid positive patient.

EVEN IF YOUR CHILD HAS HAD A COVID TEST (i.e. on day 5 or day 6 or day 7 or day 8....) AND THE TEST RESULTS COME BACK NEGATIVE YOU MUST STILL SELF-ISOLATE FOR THE FULL 14 DAYS!

If your child has no symptoms after 14 days, he or she can return to school and other activities. If your child develops any symptoms, your child MUST get a covid test (self-isolate until test comes back negative) and duration of further self-isolation (if positive) will be determined by public health.
